

SEARCH FOR KOENIG IN WELLAND PLOT.

Another Charge Preferred Against the Man Out on \$50,000 Bail.

New York, Jan. 15.—The police searched to-day for Paul Koenig, the so-called chief of the Hamburg-American line secret service, who is at liberty under \$50,000 bail on a federal indictment charging him with conspiracy to blow up the Welland canal. A warrant for Koenig's arrest was issued yesterday by a magistrate charging him with corruptly influencing Frederick Scheindl, formerly a clerk in the National City Bank, to deliver letters and telegrams to Koenig. Scheindl was arrested and released on bail some time ago. The new charge against Koenig is a misdemeanor which carries a maximum penalty of three years in the penitentiary. The police say they were unable to find Koenig at a hotel where he was supposed to be living.

The federal grand jury continued to-day its investigation of alleged alien plots. It is said that only the edges of the conspiracy have as yet been touched by the federal authorities. Other indictments may be returned against persons whose names have not been publicly mentioned in connection with the alleged conspiracies.
