

VON PAPEN'S PAPERS SHOW PAYMENTS TO PLOTTERS IN CANADA

Kaltschmidt, Windsor Plotter, Given \$1,000 in February for Unknown Reason

London, Jan. 20 —Stubs from Captain Von Papen's check books, arranged in order, form a remarkable diary of the German military attache's operations from September 8, 1914, to October 28, 1915. It shows that Von Papen had a man named Det'aserta in Ottawa, to whom he paid \$500. The stubs shows payments last September of nearly \$200 to Paul Koenig, which probably covers the expense bills of Koenig and three others when they attempted to blow up the Welland canal. They also show that Von Papen paid \$700 to a man named Horn. Horn is identified with Werner Horn, who attempted to blow up the Canadian Pacific bridge on the New Brunswick-Maine boundary last February. A Kaltschmidt, said to be a wealthy man in Detroit, received \$1,000 but the nature of his activities is not disclosed. Kaltschmidt was implicated in attempts to destroy public buildings at Windsor
