

WAS BAYONETTED BY A HUN IN CANADIAN TROOPS

Former Toronto City Employee Relates
Tale He Heard About Teuton
Who Enlisted With Canadians.

Toronto, Feb. 10.—A sensational story is contained in a letter written by a former city hall employee, now with the Canadian troops at Folkestone, England. It is to the effect that a German who enlisted in a Canadian battalion bayoneted a comrade with whom one night he was sent to the listening post.

"The fellow I sleep with met his brother here yesterday, who has been wounded and sent back," the letter says in part. "He told us how two men of his section are sent out nightly to the listening post, about 125 yards in front of their trenches,

Killed Comrade.

A short time ago two were sent out as usual, and at dawn they didn't return. On investigating, they found one dead, with the other's bayonet through his back, with the following note pinned on the end: "Thanks for bringing me this far. I will go the rest myself." He was a German who had enlisted in Canada."
