

# TORONTO CITIZENS FAVOR CHANGING NAME OF BERLIN

Feel That Prejudice is Created  
Throughout the Empire  
By Use of Name

Toronto, Feb. 12.—A meeting of 150 representative citizens here yesterday passed the following resolution, six abstaining from voting and one voting against. The latter was hissed from the room as he recorded his vote:

"Whereas, it would appear that strong prejudice has been created throughout the British Empire against the name Berlin, and all the name implies, and whereas the citizens of this city fully appreciate that that prejudice is but natural, it being absolutely impossible for any loyal citizen to consider it complimentary to be called after the capital of Prussia, be it therefore, and it is hereby resolved, that the city council be petition to take necessary steps to have the name Berlin changed to some other name more in keeping with our national sentiments."
