## HUNS PLACE DYNAMITE IN AMERICAN COAL?

## FIND MADE IN CAR THAT MIGHT HAVE GONE TO MUNITIONS FACTORY,

Employees of the Crosby Coal Company, rear of 355 Sorauren avenue, while unloading a car of coal in the company's yards on Saturday discovered a fifteen-inch stick of dynamite on top of the snow-covered coal. The dynamite has been deposited in a snow bank.

The coal came from Pennsylvania by way of Buffalo to the local firm. Mr. Crosby believes that the dynamite was placed on the car in Buffalo by Gorman agents. The car contained soft coal. The presence of many munitions factories in Parkdale substantiates his impression that the dynamite did not come into the car accidentally, but was placed there by allen enemies, who hoped that ŧŁ would find its way to some of the Parkdale factories working upon war orders.
