

# DYNAMITE FOUND UNDER FOUNDRY AT WINDSOR, ONT.

**Explosive So Placed That Very  
Heavy Damage Would  
Have Been Done**

DETROIT, Mich., Feb. 19.—Discovery of a carefully laid plot to blow up a Windsor, Ont. foundry is the latest development in the local dynamite investigation. Pinkerton operatives found dynamite so placed that at least as much damage as was done to the Peabody factory in Walkerville last June probably would have followed an explosion.

The discovery was made several days ago but the secret was guarded. The dynamite is held as evidence. W. H. Jenkins, superintendent of the local Pinkerton agency, admitted this yesterday.

Proceeding on the theory that Otto Bartholma and Ernest McCord, who are under arrest, are members of a gang organized to destroy factories turning out war materials in the United States and Canada, the Detroit police are trying to trace their associates.

The two prisoners talked freely to the detectives. They denied they planned to destroy the plant or that they had any guilty knowledge of firing the Ottawa parliament buildings or blowing up Canadian bridges.
