TWO GERMANS INTERNED.

Failed to Register and Accused p Pro-German Utterances.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Berlin, Ont., March 6.—Two more Germans, Max Homfeldt of Williamsburg and Hans Gerritzen of this city, will be sent to the internment camp at Fort Henry in a few days. These aliens have failed to register, and have been accused of uttering proferman sentiments openly. Others are expected to follow unless they put in an appearance at registration headquarters.

KELLY APPEAL DISMISSED.

Another Step in Civil Suits Over Manitoba Parliament Buildings, (Canadian Press Despatch.)

Winnipeg, March 6 .- Tho of Thomas Kelly & Sons in the civil suit brought against them Province of Manitoba, in connection with the Parliament buildings, against the order for fuller and better production of documents, was dismissed by the Court of Appeals this morning. In view of the possibility that the defence will carry the point to the Privy Council, a stay of proceedings until Thursday was granted. Appeal was made on the ground that a further production of documents might tend to incriminate the defendants.
