

WELLS WOULD LIKE CHARGE ALIEN CAMP

Declares McPhail and He Would See Germans Got Treatment They Deserve

The Royal Theatre resounded with cheers and thunderous hand clapping, Tuesday evening, for Sergt. Fred. Wells and Brandon's returned soldier heroes, who were honored guests of the evening. When speaking of his treatment, and the treatment of the soldiers of the Allies, at the German internment camps, Sergeant Wells mentioned one of Brandon's bravest of the brave who have returned from this war, Pte. McPhail; of how he came upon the latter in a German internment camp, sitting before a plate of food which was untouched. In response to his inquiries as to why he had not eaten the food, Pte. McPhail had answered that the Germans in their fiendish cruelty had deprived him of his eyesight, and he was unable to see what was before him. The speaker asked that Private McPhail, who was seated with the other returned soldiers, should stand up which he did amidst rounds of applause and cheers. Sergeant Wells expressed the desire that Pte. McPhail and himself be placed in charge of the Brandon internment camp, where they would see that the Germans there received as good treatment as was meted out to the Canadians who were prisoners of war in Germany, by their fellow countrymen.
