

SIR SAM ATTENDED BY THREE ON HIS TRIP

HON. J. D. HAZEN AND SENATOR
LOUGHEED ACTED DURING
1914 AND 1915.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Ottawa, April 5.—Questions by Mr. A. B. Copp (Westmoreland) and Mr. J. A. C. Ethier (Two Mountains), as to the visits of Major-General Sir Sam Hughes, drew the information that on his three trips to England since the outbreak of the war the Minister had been attended by a Staff officer and by two orderlies. His entourage on the present trip includes Staff Officer Capt. John Bassett, drawing \$7 per day for pay and field allowance and two Sergeants, who act as orderlies.

During his first trip in 1914 Hon. J. D. Hazen was acting Minister of Militia, and during the 1915 trip, from June to September, Hon. Senator Lougheed was acting Minister. It may be noted that it was during Senator Lougheed's administration that the fuse contracts with the United States companies were entered into, although they were ratified by Major-General Hughes.

NOT THE DANGEROUS ALIENS.

Only Destitute Ones May Work on
Farms; to be Reasonably Paid.

Ottawa, April 5.—The suggestion that interned alien enemies should be released to help in Canadian farming operations does not propose to include those interned for offensive reasons, but only those taken in charge because of destitution. Farmers would have to pay them reasonably for their work. Some such have already been released for service.
