WATCH ALIENS AT EXITS ON BORDER

R.N.W.M.P. Patrol Manitoba for First Time In 30 Years— 32 Men In Party

For the first time in nearly 30 years, a large squad of Royal North-West Mounted Police is on active duty in Manitoba today to watch the movements of aliens.

The "mounties" are patrolling the southern boundary of the province from Ontario to Saskatchewan, and are in charge of Inspector S. T.

Wood.

Thirteen members of the force arrived in Winnipeg Monday, and left Monday evening for Emerson and Gretna. Another squad of 20 went south from Brandon at the same time, they will make their head-quarters at Boissevain. This squad is in charge of Assistant Commissioner Wilson.

A few years ago the provincial government made arrangements with the Dominion government to have a small squad of the mounted police patrol the Manitoba territory, north of The Pas, but this squad never numbered more than five or six men, and it was never seen in the settled parts of the province.

Last year the southern border was patrolled by the Mounted Rifles, under Major Stone. The provincial and the Dominion police will assist the Mounted Police in their work this year. No aliens will be allowed to cross the line without proper credentials.
