AUSTRIAN DISAPPEARS WAS FORMERLY INTERNED

Liberated Some Time Ago He Became Dissatisfied with Wages and Left Farm

Max Schmidt, an Austrian, has disappeared from the farm of Mr. J. E. Emery, a few miles from the city. The man had been released from the internment camp some two months ago, but was not regarded as a dan-

ago, but was not regarded as a dangerous man. He did not come under the farmers scheme and is thought to have gone to look for work elsewhere as his contract with the farmer was not all that he desired, bigger wages being obtainable elsewhere.

When interviewed today Major Coleman, of the internment camp, said Schmidt had given no trouble whatever since his incarceration. He is not a German, no Germans being allowed out at all. Major Coleman adds that there are many farmers unable to get men from the camp, about fifty available men refusing to go out. They prefer being inside where they are sure of good food and comfortable housing with a normal amount of

labor each day.
