

EASY TO BUILD GOOD TRUNK ROAD BRANDON-CARBERRY

**Prov. Highways Commissioner
and Party Travel Over Route,
Find Few Difficulties**

INSPECT THE ROUTE

**Three Ravines Entail Expense
and Labor—Top Dressing of
Gravel Sufficient Elsewhere**

Another promising step has been taken toward the building of a good road between Brandon and Carberry, through Sewell Camp. On Tuesday Mr. A. McGilliray, Provincial Highways Commissioner, went over the road with Mr. S. E. Clement, M.P.P., and Ald. Fisher and McKenzie, and it was found that only three ravines will have to be dealt with. All the rest of the road is fairly level and a top dressing of gravel will suffice. It was pointed out that this road will form a part of the trunk highway which is to run through the province. This trunk road is already completed from Virden to the western boundary and also a portion of it has already been built between Winnipeg and Portage. It is confidently hoped to have the Brandon to Carberry portion finished this season, especially in view of the fact that the Federal government has practically offered to give the labor of the interned aliens here and provide them with housing, food and pay at twenty-five cents per day.
