

BERLIN WILL CHANGE NAME

City Voters To Get Away From
Memories of Germany

Berlin, Ont., May 19.—By a majority of 81, the citizens of Berlin today decided to change the name of the city. The vote in the referendum enjoined by the legislature was an exceptionally large one, the number of ballots cast for the change of name being 1,569, and against 1,488. Out of twenty-three subdivisions twelve gave majorities in favor of the change. The victory of the supporters of the law was to-

night celebrated by a procession. With the exception of a slight disturbance, when a prominent opponent of the bylaw protested against a serenade, there was no disorder. A committee of ninety-nine prominent citizens will be appointed to decide on a new name for the city.
