

FORMER INTERNED

ALIEN IN TROUBLE

Committed for Trial on Charge of Theft of \$120 from Fellow Worker

James Havrelcoff, an Austrian youth between sixteen and seventeen years of age, was brought to Brandon today to stand trial for the theft of \$120 from a fellow workman at Elgin last Saturday. The accused admitted his guilt at the preliminary trial held Tuesday. Magistrate Fraser and Crown Prosecutor Matheson went from Brandon to take the case. The youth was formerly in the internment camp here and went to work in a section gang about two weeks ago. On Saturday he went with three companions to town and returned before them. He cut the wad from the overalls of his compatriot and had made ready to leave in haste. When taxed with the theft he denied it and the complainant used violence to such an extent that he confessed and gave back the money. The section foreman handed him over to the police to save him from further violence. The accused talks perfect English and says he was interned first in Winnipeg where he had been employed in a bakery.
