## GERMANS INTERNED SALUTED THE DUKE

GOVERNOR-GENERAL CONVER-SES WITH OFFICER REGARD: ED AS THEIR LEADER,

Halifax, Aug. 23.-An interesting episode in the visit of the Governor-General to Hallfax occurred yesterday when his Royal Highness was in the citadel. Interned there are three hundred German prisoners, all officers, the rank and file being in the detention camp in much greater numbers at Amherst. The Duke was escorted into the enclosure where the prisoners are kept at the citadel, was introduced to the officer who is looked upon as their leader. Royal Highness conversed for some time with this German and passed up and down the lines where the other prisoners could see hir: and he them. They raised their hats and saluted as Governor-General passed, appeared pleased to have this visit the representative from King George.

## RUSS TAKE GERMAN SHIP.

## Desterro With Iron Ore Captured— Flew Swedish Fing.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Berlin, Aug. 25.—The capture of the German steamship Desterro, with a cargo of iron ore, was made by a itussian submarine flying the Swedish flag, says the Overseas News Agency. Despatches from Stockholm say the Desterro was seized in Swedish territorial waters, having on board a Swedish pilot, who has now returned to Haparanda. The vessel was taken into Raumo, Finland.

"This flagrant violation of Swedish neutrality." the News Agency says, "has produced excitement in Sweden and embittered the feeling of the people."
