

WANTS GERMANS DEPORTED.

Kingston, Aug. 28.—(Special.)—Major P. G. C. Campbell, commanding Fort Henry Internment camp, applied to United States Consul Johnson to take steps to try to have the two German prisoners who escaped from the fort last week and entered the United States at Clayton, N. Y., deported as undesirable. The fact that they are said to have admitted stealing a boat at Gananoque puts them in the category of thieves. Gen. Otter, who is in command of Internment operations for Canada, is here to inquire into their escape.

REFUGEES CROWD KAVALA.

Kavala, Greece, Aug. 27.—The effects of the Bulgarian occupation of Doxato, the scene of alleged atrocities of which the Greeks accused the Bulgars in the last war, is prodigious. Kavala is the theatre of amazing scenes of disorder. Thousands of refugees are pouring into this port from the hinterland and crowding the steep, narrow streets until they are impassable. The streets are littered with every kind of household goods, flung away by the owners, fleeing before the advancing Bulgarians as before the plague.
