

**LONDON'S CITY AUDITOR.**

**W. H. Dunlop of Ottawa Selected by the City Council.**

London, Ont., Sept. 5.—London's new City Auditor will be Mr. W. H. Dunlop, a chartered accountant, of Ottawa. His appointment was made at to-night's meeting of the City Council. There were several applications for the position rendered vacant by the resignation of Mr. Frank Jewell, and the choice was narrowed down to Mr. Dunlop and Mr. W. R. Jex, a former Londoner now in Winnipeg. The selection of Mr. Dunlop was made unanimous. The question of salary is to be considered later, though it is understood the minimum will be \$3,000.

**ALIEN ENEMY INTERNED.**

**Kitchener Fireman Tried to Cross Border Without Permission.**

Kitchener, Sept. 5. — Frederick Busch, formerly of the local Fire Department, who was registered as an alien enemy, has landed at the internment camp at Fort Henry as a result of attempting to cross the boundary without permission. Although a married man, he was, it is alleged, followed by a widow of this city, who met him at Niagara Falls, where the immigration officials laid hands on Busch and had him sent to the detention camp. Busch applied some days ago to Mayor Hett for papers to go to the United States, but was refused. He was a member of the Fire Department since 1911.
