

GERMAN MADE GET-A-WAY

USED ROPE AND DROPPED OUT
OF WINDOW AT HOSPITAL.

Second Time He Has Escaped From
This Institution Inside of a Few
Months—Caught Hiding in Boiler
of an Engine at Windsor.

For the second time within a few months a German prisoner of war, who has been confined to Rockwood Hospital, made his escape from that institution on Monday night, and is now at large.

The German managed to get possession of a stout piece of rope, and while in the bath room, he fastened the rope so as he could let himself out the window to the first floor. The rope was not long enough to reach the ground, so he jumped to the ground, a distance of about twelve feet, and made good his escape.

As soon as he was missed, guards made a search of the grounds and vicinity, but as far as can be learned no trace whatever has been found. It is believed that he headed for the United States.

This is the German who, on the occasion of his last escape, was found hiding in a boiler of an engine at Windsor. The engine was going over to Detroit, and he took this means of getting across the border, but trainmen found him, and he was placed under arrest. It was afterwards found that he was a missing patient from Rockwood Hospital, and so he was handed over to the authorities and brought back to Kingston.

The German is registered at Fort Henry under the name of Paul Bruns, and is twenty-nine years of age.
