

OFFICER RESIGN IN BODY

Big Surprise Sprung at Camp Borden Yesterday.

Camp Borden Sept. 21. — Surprise was occasioned in Camp Borden late yesterday when it became known that twelve officers of the 118th (Waterloo) Battalion had resigned in a body. Major-General W. A. Logie admitted the fact to the Daily News and intimated that a reorganization of the battalion would take place immediately. "I am holding Lieut.-Col. Lohead, responsible for the resignations of the officers," said General Logie, when asked what reason has been the cause of the wholesale resignation. This is the usual procedure. The except instance is an Irishman. It is declared emphatically that presence of the German-speaking soldiers in the battalion has nothing to do with the withdrawal of the dozen officers.
