

MANY SEEK CITIZENSHIP

Those of Enemy Nationality Must Wait

Ottawa, Sept. 29.—Although many applications for naturalization under the Act of 1914 are being received by the State Department those from applicants of enemy alien birth are not being granted at present.

Many of these have come from Germans in the counties of Waterloo, Perth, Huron, Bruce and South Wellington, who came to Canada after the war of 1870, and who supposed that their long residence made them full-fledged Canadian subjects. Recent events have shown them their error.

Many natives of Austria have also made application.

Regarding applications from natives of the Allied countries of France, Belgium, Russia, Italy and Roumania, naturalization is being withheld unless they have fulfilled their military obligations to the countries of their birth or have secured formal exemption.
