

Mancherick Seditious Case Is On Appeal

Before the court of appeal today the reserve case of Albert R. Mancherick, charged with sedition, and convicted at Morden before Mr. Justice Macdonald, was argued. W. H. Trueman, appearing for the accused, argued that the statements complained of were made privately to two of the accused's neighbors, and that they were not seditious, as the accused did not contemplate the spreading abroad of his sentiments. Mancherick is alleged to have said he hoped the Canadian soldiers would never return to Canada. A. McLeod, K.C., of Morden, is appearing for the crown.
