## WATERLOO COUNTY'S UNIQUE SUPPORT PLAN

\$500 GRANT TO DEPENDENTS OF UNMARRIED SOLDIERS WHO DIE THROUGH WAR.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.) Kitchener, Dec. 19 .- At this morning's session of the Waterloo County Council the by-law drawn up by the joint Recruiting Leagues of the smaller towns of the county making provision for the support of dependents of unmarried soldiers who have gone to the front was Dassed unanimously. The by-law provided that a grant of \$500 be given to the dependents of unmarried soldiers who, after having resided in Waterloo county for a period of six months, enlist for active service at the front and are killed while on active service or die as the result of sickness or from wounds received while on active service within a period of one year after the close of the war. The amount is to be paid in monthly installments of \$10, and the fund is to be administered by a Commission of five members of the County Council.
