

SEVEN AUSTRIANS GIVEN FINES FOR BREAKING PAROLE

Stiff Sentences Were Handed
Out by Magistrate Elliot
in Court

To indulge in the sport of breaking parole is a costly pastime, at least in this part of His Majesty's Dominion, and this, seven Austrians learned to their sorrow on Monday morning when they appeared before Magistrate A. Elliot, and heard him read out sentences that replenished the city's coffers to the extent of over \$600. The men arraigned were placed under arrest on Sunday by the military police of the 51st-Regiment who were on duty at the government dock. They had boarded the ferry for the Michigan Soo and were in a fair way of getting over when detected by the soldiers. They were immediately turned over to the city police for trial. The following are the men and the fines imposed: Harry Sydslrik, fined \$204.60; Fred Semboluk, \$104.60; Andre Chodoroski, \$54.60; Wasyl Howleyh, \$54.60; Toni Haminuk, \$54.60; John Nastuzuk, \$54.60; Alex. Miluecyuk, \$104.60. The last named man did not pay his fine so will give the district three months of his time at the jail.
