## WERNER HORN MUST SUBMIT TO A TRIAL

## German Who Dynamited a Bridge Near Vanceboro Loses Habeas Corpus Suit

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
Washington, March 6.—Werner
Horn, the German reservist Lieutenant who dynamited the International
Bridge near Vanceboro', Maine, in
1915, to-day lost his habeas corpus
suit in the Supreme Court, in which
he sought to avoid being tried at
Boston for alleged transportation of
explosives on passenger trains.

The court did not decide Horn's contentions that in a belligerent act against Canada his German army commission exempted him from American prosecution and made him punishable only by the State Department. The court said Horn's appeal was not authorized and dismissed it.
