

ALIENS ARE WORKING IN MUNITIONS PLANT

Strange Conditions Found to Obtain By Coroner's Jury in Toronto.

TORONTO, April 5.—At the inquest into the death of Tony Karbchuck, an Austrian, who died as result of injuries he received while riding on a travelling derrick at the munitions works of McGregor and McIntyre, here, the superintendent of the factory, J. S. Sandusky, admitted that he was born in Germany and had not been naturalized as a Canadian. It was brought out in the testimony that practically eighty per cent. of the employes were foreigners of alien enemy countries.

Coupled with the verdict of accidental death, the jury added a rider to the effect that the Imperial Munitions Board should be apprised of the fact.
