LINE TO KIRKLAND LAKE.

Kirkland Lake, April 21 .- The T. & N. O. Railway Commission is understood to have set aside \$125,000 for the purpose of construction of a branch line from Swastika to Kirkland Lake. This, however, does not necessarily mean that the road will be built or commenced at once, but is merely a proviso, so that should it be deemed advisable to do so at short notice the mat-ter could be gone on with without any delay. An additional \$20,000 has been set uside for the construction of sidings at Swantike.

Porcupine, April 21.—Very encouraging results are attending mining operations at the Hollinger Reserve, according to latest advice received here.
