

TROTSKY TROUBLED WEST

Leader of Russian Maximalists Lived
in Saskatoon—Spread Propaganda
Among Doukhobors.

Winnipeg, Nov. 12.—Word from Saskatoon, Sask., states: Leon Trotsky, leader of the Maximalists in Russia, for two years lived here, making it his headquarters for a social-democrat propaganda among the Russians in Western Canada. He was later arrested at Montreal by the Immigration authorities, but was released on the intercession of Kerensky. He was very active in the Doukhobor settlements and caused much unrest there and worry to Government officials.
