Montreal Freight Handlers Urge Drastic Measures Against <mark>Alien</mark> Foes

(Canadian Press Despatch.) Montreal, Dec. 24 .--- The freight andlers of the port of Montreal ave agreed to constitute themselves volunteer army of guardians of he harbor here. They say they inend to urge upon the authorities he adoption of drastic measures with regard to the protection of the arbor. They want a law forbidling alien enemies, under penalty of leath, from approaching within a nile of the harbor limits on either shore of the river, this to especially ipply to the place known locally as 'Goose Village." near Victoria Bridge. The freight handlers ask that he entire crew of every ship calling at Montreal be registered; that no person under the influence of liquor be tolerated upon the harbor front, and that munition ships be forbidlen to make any stop-over between the port of loading and their port of destination, and that any additional orders they must receive must be given them at sea at a distance of not less than three miles from shore.
