

INTERNED AT WINDSOR

Three Members of "Katinka" Co. Not Naturalized

Windsor, Ont., January 21.—Three members of "Katinka," a musical comedy, were ordered interned here today. They are Max Drossman, Hugo Zorning and William Fleck. Alphonse Bachelder, manager of the company, was fined \$600 and costs in the police court for assisting the Germans into the Dominion. The theatrical group entered Canada on January 6, according to travelling inspector David H. Reynolds. Bachelder, when passing inspection at Windsor, signed a manifest stating that members of the company were United States citizens. The manager was arrested in Toronto Sunday night and brought here for trial. He pleaded that as the Germans had taken out their first United States citizenship papers, he considered his action in making out the manifest legal. A fine of \$200 and costs was also imposed on each alien enemy.

"This is war time," said Magistrate Leggatt, "We must be strict, even severe. I hope your experience will act as a warning to others."

The Germans were interned because the United States immigration authorities at Detroit would not allow them to re-enter the country.
