## IS SEEKING TO OUST ALIENS IN BUSINESS

## ALD, PLEWMAN'S MOTION PRO-VIDES FOR CANCELLATION OF BUSINESS LICENSES.

In accordance with Ald. Plewman's notice at the last meeting of the City Council he intends at the next meeting to move an alternative motion to that of Ald. F. M. Johnston, askiew the Police Commission to cancel business licenses on July 1 that are held by alters.

Ald. Plewman's motion is as follows:

That this municipal corporation memorialize the Governor-in-Council requesting:

(I) That steps be taken to place the movements and the labor of enomy allens under absolute Govern-1 ment control, that such enemy allens be employed at work of national importance such as food production and road construction, and that they be not used on alleplane construction or in factories of an inflammable nature engaged in producing war materials.

(2) That under no circumstances shall such enemy allens be permitted to receive more than the equivalent of a soldler's pay, and that in the event of any enemy allens being permitted to work in privately-owned war factories or other private enterprises they be paid by the flowernment and the full market value of their services be paid over to the Government for the general purposes of the war.

Government That the en-(3)deavor to arrange with all allied Governments that citizens of allied countries of military age resident in Canada legally may be brought under the operation of the Military Service Act unless they with the enlist armies of their national Government.
