

## RECRUITING JEWS ALL OVER CANADA

### Capt. Paul Sise in Montreal and Coming to Toronto

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Montreal, May 2.—Captain Paul Sise, who went overseas with the 148th Battalion and has for some time past been in the United States on special service, arrived in Montreal to-day to undertake special service here in the recruiting of young men for the Jewish battalions now being recruited in the United States and Canada for service with the British Expeditionary Force in Palestine. Capt. Sise stated that he had been at Headquarters in Ottawa for the past few days, making arrangements for his work, which would include Jewish recruiting all over Canada.

While here Capt. Sise said that he would work in collaboration with the special civilian committee in charge of the recruiting for this special service, and as soon as the necessary arrangements had been made here he would proceed to Toronto to take up similar work there, also in cooperation with the Jewish civilian committee.

### Patriotic Moncton Wants Principles Taught

#### Halifax Wants Official Back From The Front.

Halifax, N.S., May 2.—The City Board of Control, which recently requested the release of Major E. W. W. Doane, City Engineer, from military service overseas, was to-day informed that the following cable had been received at Military Headquarters, Ottawa:

"Is return to Canada of Major Doane imperative? He does not desire to return otherwise."

The Board decided to notify the authorities that it considered Major Doane's return to his civic duties imperative in the interests of Halifax.

### SANK CHINESE STEAMER.

#### Gunboat on Yangtse-Kiang Col- lides With Passenger Vessel.

Hankow, China, April 26. — A Chinese gunboat carrying Premier Tuan Chi-Jui up the Yangtse-Kiang last night on a visit to the Commanders of the northern troops collided with and sank the Chinese steamship Kiang-Kwan, of 1,920 tons gross. The warship was damaged.

Dr. George D. Lowry of the Methodist Episcopal Mission of Peking, the Rev. Mr. Ridgely, and 50 natives aboard the steamship were saved. The Premier remained on board the gunboat.
