Both men were handling ten head of cattle and in their efforts to drive the cattle over the crossing in saftty before the arrival of the fast approaching passenger train were themselves struck. His left leg was amputated below the knee, his skull fractured and his face badly lacerated.

Little hope for his recovery was held out from the time he was admitted to the Western Hospital. He was proposed to any way suffering and was authorized. was suffering was unconscious and from loss of blood in addition to other injuries. The body will be taken to the Morgue, and a coroner's inquest held.
