

TANNERS ON STRIKE OVER DISMISSAL

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Kingston, June 18.—Forty-seven

out of about seventy employees of the tannery of A. Davis & Sons went on strike to-day because the company dismissed five of their number, who hold positions in the new Tanners' Union recently formed here. Three weeks ago an Arbitration Board, presided over by Judge Gunn of Ottawa, sat here to hear a dispute raised by the tanners over dismissal of one of their number, J. Kennedy. The Davis Company held the man was dismissed because he was not giving value for the money paid him, while Judge Gunn held that the reason of the dismissal was because Kennedy was engaged in forming a union of tanners.

It is declared by the strikers that of twenty or more men still at work twelve are **alien enemies.**
