SOLDIERS WERE SENT TO OVERAWE ALIENS

AS EFFECTIVE CHECK TO OPEN OPPOSITION TO REGISTRA-TION IN WINDSOR,

(Special Despatch to The Globe.) Windsor, June 23.—More than three hundred troops, Including machine gun batteries and a bombing squad, arrived here yesterday to deal with the alien enemy menace which was uncovered last Wednesday, by the arrest of John Perehuda, alleged German agent and I. W. W. organizer, on charges of inciting the foreign element in border cities to resist registration.

The Military authorities at London despatched the troops by special train after reports reached the Militia Department that the allens were preparing to offer organized resistance in the event of the civil police making any attempt to arrest them for non-registration.

While there was no outbreak of violence, the authorities believed a display of military force would be an effective check to any open opposition to registration. A good many of the Russians and Austrians falled to register yesterday, and these will be dealt with in due course.

No steps were taken to-day towards making a house-to-house canvass of the alien residents in Windsor and Ford, although this hadbeen the intention. Another and perhaps more effective step is contemplated, it is said, which will definitely bring to light every single violation of the foreigners to register. Meanwhile the troops will remain here.
