

ANTI-LOAFING LAW IS WORKING WELL

**Government May Comb Out Able-
Bodied Men From Less
Essential Jobs.**

Ottawa, July 4.—Reports on the labor situation received here are to the effect that the anti-loafing law has worked well in preventing intermittent and fitful labor and in forcing men to engage themselves in some sort of useful employment.

Local Magistrates are taking advantage of the act to good effect.

It is stated here, however, that the Government is seriously contemplating some measure whereby the employment of able-bodied men in certain less essential industries will be forbidden. Such employments would include those of barbers, waiters, shoeshiners, chauffeurs, etc.
