NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIEN BILL ADOPTED BY HOUSE OF COMMONS,

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
London, July 19.—In the House of

Commons to-day the British Nationality and Status of Allens Bill was amended by adding a provision that no certificate of nationality shall be granted for a period of five years after the war to any German subject or any subject of any country at war with Great British uncless he has served in the British or allied forces, is a member of a race or community known to be opposed to unemy Governments or was a British subject at birth.

Another amendment was adopted empowering the Home Office to assent to the application of a Britishborn wife of an enemy allen to resume her British nationality.

The British Nationality and Status of Alien Bill was adopted by the House of Commons to-day by a unanimous vote.
