by him. Nothing of his personal effeets were saved. Factory Completely Gutted. The factory was a large two-story building and was completely gutted. The fire is stated to have started in one of the waste paper machines in the cellar. The cellarman, the ware-houseman, and the assistant shipper have been held as witnesses, they have been held as witnesses, they being the first men to have seen the fire.
