

Had Not Proper Credentials.— Twelve men, who, whether intentionally or not, failed to produce the proper papers when questioned by the Dominion police, appeared in the provincial police court yesterday. One was remanded and one dismissed. Anton Kolzysycki paid \$25 and costs. Jacob Karas, had no marriage certificate and had to pay \$5, and Joseph F. Johnson, having no birth certificate, had to pay the costs of the court. Peter McAllister, a discharged soldier, paid \$5 for failure to register and was handed over to the military authorities to get exemption as unfit. The same ruling applied to Tom Haluski, but, as he had tried to enlist several times after being discharged as unfit, he was fined only the costs of the court and turned over to the military authorities. Michael Dubek is under age, he says, but had no paper saying so. It cost him \$5, while Robert Klatt, who left his marriage certificate at home, paid \$10. Fines of \$10 were also imposed on John Lazarenko and Dmytro Tucha and Nicholas Straychalski and John Voschillo had to hand out \$5 each. Calus Hodo, who was arrested in the United States and charged with failure to carry papers proving himself a Norwegian, was dismissed. He was re-arrested, however, just as he stepped out of the

court. He had registered, but failed to report for duty when ordered to do so. He will be tried by court-martial as being a deserter.
