

ALIEN ENEMIES OFF TO REAP THE CROPS

About 350 of Them Permitted to Go West With Harvesters

When the harvesters' excursions pulled out of the Union Station on Tuesday and Thursday they took with them among the passengers some 350 residents of Toronto who are officially classified as alien enemies. Their departure was not interfered with nor discouraged by the police, who believe that it is a good thing to have them assisting in work of great national importance. This is directly opposite to the course pursued in Brantford, where the Chief of Police detained some 25 registered aliens who were desirous of going west on the excursions. Owing to the attitude adopted by the Toronto police these 350 aliens will in a short time be taking their part in garnering the grain crop in the West. Many of them, it is said, will make their home permanently the other side of the Great Lakes. Before they were allowed to leave the city it was seen to that their registration and other papers were in proper order, when they were given official permission to go.
