

ENCHUK IS HELD ON CHARGE UNDER WAR MEASURES ACT

Bail ~~Was~~ Refused This
Morning by Magistrate
Elliot

Wasył Enchuk is being held by the police on a serious charge, preferred against him by Crown Attorney G. W. Goodwin, on behalf of the Federal Government, who will prosecute Enchuk for having objectionable matter in his possession, in violation of an order-in-council under the War Measures Act.

Enchuk is secretary of a Finnish society in the west end of the city, which holds meetings every Sunday afternoon in George Alexander's office, which is in the Polopchuk building at 433 Queen street west. The evidence already secured by the authorities was considered to be of such a serious nature that bail was refused when he came before Magistrate Elliot this morning.

Mr. Uriah McFadden, who is appearing for the defendant, asked the Crown to name the amount of bail that would be acceptable, as there were a large number of Enchuk's friends who were willing to put up bail for him. But on the advice of the crown attorney the magistrate refused to accept bail. The preliminary hearing was adjourned till September 5.

Seven Italians were fined \$2 and costs, this morning for refusing to pay their poll tax when asked.
