RUSSIAN "REDS" HEAVILY FINED

Nineteen of Them From Ford Mulcted in \$2,759----Menace in Detroit

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, Dec. 17.—Perhaps the largest amount ever collected in fines in any Police Court in western Ontario at a single session was imposed to-day by Magistrate Miers here, when 19 Russians living in Ford were fined a total of \$2,759.02.

The aliens were a part of a group of 23 arrested on October 20 last, when a squad of police headed by Provincial Officers Smith and Hannah raided a schoolhouse in Ford where Russlans were holding a Bolshevik meeting.

Five other Russians, charged with having prohibited literature in their possession, contrary to Dominion order in Council, were fined \$218 each. Copies of a pamphlet entitled "Daily Free Russia," printed in Chicago, were found on them.

Crown Attorney Rodd declares that Russian "Reds" in Detroit are becoming a menace, and he has received information that recently some 5,000 of them joined a Socialist organization in Detroit, the meetings being held every Sunday evening.

Hungary's Government Interns Mackensen

Copenhagen, Dec. 17.—Pield Marshal von Mackensen, Commander of the German forces in Roumania, has been interned by the Hungarian Government, according to The Az Est of Budapest. The Hungarian Government is reported to have Informed the German leader that his internment was demanded by the allies. Other despatches received here from Hungary say that the Roumanians have disarmed and interned the rear guard of Field Marshal von Mackensen's forces.
