ALIEN ASSURANCE.

A convention of Ukrainians held in Sastions which showed a good deal of assur-ance. The convention expressed its "strong disapproval" of educational amendments katoon a few days ago passed several resoluabet. The contention expressed his should disapproval" of educational amendments "by which the 65,000 Ukrainian people of Saskatchewan are being discriminated against as one particular nationality." It protested "most strongly" against the ap-pointment of Dr. T. M. Anderson as Director of Education for the non-English settlements in Saskatchewan because of "his marked hostility to the Ukrainian citizens of Can-ada." It demanded the "immediate repeal" of the order in Council prohibiting the publication of Ukrainian books and newspapers without the required English translation in parallel columns. It is true the delegates expressed pleasure at the Allied victory and affirmed their loyalty, but in attacking the educational laws of Saskatchewan they educational laws of Saskatchewan they assume that the privilege of using or teaching their own language in the primary schools, which they have had for years to a limited extent, belongs to them as a right. If the demands of the Ukrainians were conceded every other alien group in the country would have the same claim. Alien propaganda across the line prompted Colonel Roosevelt to ask whether the United States was a nation or a polyglot boarding-house. Canadians might ask the same question of their own country if every foreign-born ele-ment were allowed to use the schools to pro-pagate its own language and culture.

In every alien section of the population there is a group of agitators who are finan-cially interested in stimulating and per-petuating racial sontiment, and keeping cially people of their own blood out of the main current of national life.
