

CORNWALL VETERANS FROWN ON BOLSHEVISM

Send Aliens Home Unless They Obey the Laws.

CORNWALL, Ont., Feb. 6.—The members of Cornwall Command of the Great War Veterans' Associations have placed themselves on record as being absolutely opposed to Bolshevist ideas; as being in sympathy with those who oppose Bolshevist propaganda; as seeking the co-operation of the press in that they refrain as far as possible from publishing sensational reports of anarchistic gatherings; as seeking the co-operation of clergymen, public men and public bodies to distinguish between honest working men of British descent who have their legitimate rights and grievances which should receive sympathetic consideration and anarchists who openly threaten to seize all private property and to murder its owners, the latter being nearly all aliens many under enemy influence, who if they are not satisfied with Canadian law and society, should be shipped back to their own countries.

The members of the Counties Council did not take the question of the deportation of enemy aliens very seriously. The committee on resolutions and memorials, in its report to council which was adopted recommended no action on the matter, the recommendation concluding as follows:

"We believe that such aliens have had their eyes opened sufficiently to the benefits of living under the British flag, and that in pursuing their designs against the Empire they will be cutting off their nose to spite their face, so that in time they will become law-abiding and deserving citizens. Should they show any other disposition the laws of the country are sufficiently wide and explicit to deal with each individual case as it arises."
