VETERANS EXERCISED **OVER ALIEN** LABOR

GUELPH ASSOCIATION ASKS FOR \$4 A DAY FOR MEN CALLED BEFORE MEDICAL BOARD.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.) Guelph, Feb. 6 .---- The employment of alien labor in local manufacturing establishments was the chief topic of discussion at the regular meeting of the Great War Veterans' Association. The meeting was very largely attended, and some strong opinions were expressed on this question. One veteran said this morning: "The boys are in an angry mood, and unless the authorities take up this alien labor question mood, and unless the Butherland take up this alien labor question and settle it to the satisfaction of the returned men there is liable to be some trouble. The men do not be some trouble. The men do not like the idea of foreigners, men who have not taken out their British citizenship papers, holding down have not taken out their British citizenship papers, holding down good jobs in the city while they are compelled to walk the streets, and they intend to do something about it. "They also claim that these allens, many of whom were during the war, are working for

alien energy of whom were alien energy during the war, are working for much less wages than Canadians are willing to work for, and they think that this, too, should be romedied." After the subject had been dis-cussed at some length it was finally decided to hold a public meeting, in order to let their views on this ques-tion become more widely known. Several new members were re-ceived, and a resolution was passed asking the Government to pay all men who are asked to lose a day's pay because of being called up for re-examination before a Medical Poord \$4 per day instead of \$1.10, pay because of being re-examination before a Medicas Board \$4 per day instead of \$1.10, which they receive at present.
