

# DRASTIC ALIEN ACTION ASKED

With a brief address by Frank Wise, Secretary of the Navy League in Ontario, and a lengthy resolution which would not discriminate between friendly and enemy aliens, the central branch of the Great War Veterans' Association quickly disposed of what was expected to prove a protracted debate.

A special appeal to members to attend the meeting was sent out by the Secretary at the request of the Executive, and an exceedingly large number responded. The alien resolution was spoken to by two members, one of whom pointed out that it was unfair to discriminate between friendly and enemy aliens.

The resolution which was passed was sweeping. It would disfranchise enemy aliens for a further period of fifteen years; deport all who had proven dangerous; compel all non-naturalized enemy aliens to forfeit their surplus wealth made during the war; prove that their debts and taxes had been paid, then submit to deportation; all enemy alien emigration to be restricted for a period of twenty years, all other aliens to take oath of allegiance within one year.
