barring of enemy aliens from getting business licenses, but to shut out the citizens of allied nations, such as the United States, France, Italy, Japan, China, etc., is a different matter, and one that might lead to international

In this connection it is of interest to note that Chicago City Council recently passed a by-law to bar aliens from getting business licenses, but on the protest of Secretary of State Lansing that such an ordinance was contrary to the treaty rights of many foreign nations the Council had to swallow itself and repeal the ordi-

complications.

The Chinese vice-consul has already served notice on the city that such a restriction of business liberty is a breach of comity between Brit-China under existing treaties. It is likely that there will be a conference between the Board of Control and the Police Commissioners on

Britain.
