

WINNIPEG VETERANS DEMAND ARREST OF "REDS"

Winnipeg, March 20.—War veterans in Winnipeg will accept the challenge of the Bolsheviki by demanding the deportation of "red" Socialists, I.W.W.'s and other agitators as undesirable citizens. A resolution, similar to the one adopted by the Great War Veterans at Calgary, will be adopted by the Winnipeg unit at the meeting tonight of the executive, according to John O. Newton, vice-president.

It is expected that a demand for the deportation or internment of so-called labor leaders who openly advocate revolution in Canada, and who openly endorse the Bolsheviki of Russia and the Spartacans of Germany, will be taken up by the veterans' organizations throughout the country.

Officials and other members of local veterans' associations expressed indignation over the Bolsheviki features of the platforms adopted at the Calgary convention.

"Do you think we are going to sit with folded arms while Bolsheviki here try to do to Canada what the Huns did to France and Belgium?" asked one veteran when asked his opinion. "If the 'reds' think they are going to get away with any of this 'Russian stuff' here they have another think coming." The arrest or deportation of those who gave voice to Bolsheviki sentiments at the Calgary labor convention was demanded in a resolution adopted Monday evening last by the Calgary Great War Veterans' Association.
