

Ruthenian Papers Here Will Publish In Own Language

Three Ruthenian newspapers in Winnipeg will resume publication in their native language immediately, as a result of the order in council passed at Ottawa Wednesday removing the Ruthenian language from the "enemy tongue" category, the editors announced today.

The papers affected, since the first order prohibiting publication in the Ruthenian tongue, have published in their own language with the English translation alongside. This, they claim, added considerably to the expense of publishing. The periodicals affected are: The Canadian Farmer, Canadian Ruthenian and the Ukrainian Voice.

The Working People, a Polish periodical, which discontinued publication when the original order went into effect, may be revived, it is said.
