Urge Lloyd George to Recognize Poland's Right to Teschen

DANTZIG INCLUDING

Council Also Sends Message to President Wilson of Endorsation

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

St. Catharines, April 30.-The following resolutions were passed at a meeting of the directors of the Polish Council in Canada regarding the Polish claims respecting Dantzig and Teschen, to be forwarded to Premier Lloyd George and President Wilson:

Appeal to Lloyd George.

Excellency Lloyd George, Prime Minister of Great Britain, Peace Conference, Paris:

At the plenary meeting of the Polish Council held at Hamilton on April 28, representing all Poles in Canada, the following resolutions were adopted:

Whereas, the Teschen district for conturies was Polish soil, and to-day, notwithstanding the efforts conducted the past centuries to Germanize and Bohenianize it, it is principally inhabited by Poles, and Whereas Teschen is geographically a component part of Poland, forming an integral part of the Polish coal basin, and its non-allotment to Poland would entail a sanguinary war between two nations of the Entone which might change entirely the future political structure of the Central European powers, and

the Entente which might change entirely the future political structure of the Central European powers, and Whereas the neutralization of Dantzig would be a signal German victory, and Whereas the control of the Germans over Dantzig would sever Poland from direct contact with so magnanimous a nation as Great Britain, with which the Polish nation is desirous of the closest political and economic relations, and, Whereas, without Dantzig Poland cannot be the proper bulwark against Bolshevism and will be at the mercy of Germany, which will exploit this triumph for its own benefit and for Bolshevism, and Whereas Dantzig did not become Germanized by the natural process of evolution, but through superior force and brutality, and on the basis of exceptional laws, which cannot be taken into consideration in determining national affiliations; Therefore, we carnestly appeal to your Excellency, in the name of equity and justice, to recognize the full right of Poland to Teschen and Dantzig, and thus not only save the Polish people, who never violated their oaths of fidelity, but also save the principle of right before might, of which principle you are a great and exalted advocate.
