ABUSE PROVISIONAL LIBERTY AND LOSE IT

AUSTRIANS SENT UNDER ES-CORT TO CAMP KAPUSKAS-ING FROM MONTREAL

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Montreal, May 4.—As a sequer to the May Day demonstrations on the Champ de Mars and in a public meeting held at night, when certain indiscret allens evinced too much sympathy with the lands they had turned their backs upon in bygone years, nine of them have been arrested by Capt. J. N. Carter, Registrar of Enemy Allens, and are being interned. Some of these men were taken on Thursday evening, and were promptly sent off by train under escort to Camp Kapuskasing, in northern Ontario. These men are all Austrians, who have enjoyed

liberty on parole during the war. Having abused that provisional liberty, their licenses have been rescinded.
